Another time as my I was driving out the entrance with someone else, a elderly spoke with someone on the cell phone. by this car, the car made a U turn near the security post to watch my movements while he I have been approached by a grey SUV as I walked out of the development. As I passed Rutgers, who took courses Wednesday evenings, they seem to pick this day to follow me. into this development that were never here before. Since I was a Graduate student at everybody is at work. Friday afternoon Saturday and Sunday there is a lot of cars pouring night. They are here twenty-four hours. Most of them are here during the day when Some of these individuals stay in their car and listen to music throughout the day and

At about 6am in the morning I have awoken to use the bathroom and I have seen a car across from the parking lot in Building ten, with its tail light on and as soon as he recognized that I was looking at him out the window, he drove off.

The Hampton Club condominium development on Edpas Road in New Brunswick NJ appears to be under seize by an organized crime syndicate of Spanish individuals. I have been noticing some suspicious Spanish individuals (appear to be a Gang) that drive and park near the basketball court parking lot in the visitor sections and in the perimeter of building ten near each parking lots. They seem to be here the entire day and evening in the morning hours. They have been here since January 2007. I see them driving passed the parking lot to the right of Building ten towards the next complex on the left as you drive passed the building ten parking lot on your right. These individuals do not live here. Someone also keeps coming into the bottom floor of building ten, but when I asked Management they said nobody moved in this development. I saw a tall Spanish individual as well as a female exit into a silver new model Cadillac style car two weeks ago.

suspect they are persecuting me to cause harm to me. They are being sent after me because I am pursuing a legal matter in the Appellate Courts. In the morning around 8am there are some cars across from my terrace in the parking lot that position their car towards my loft windows.

I appeared at New Brunswick Police station twice in February 2007 to fill out a police report, but Sergeant Baker or Barker said he would not file a police report based on phone numbers alone. He said he needed license plate numbers. I have called police to investigate suspicious people that I observed in the Hampton Club but I rarely seen police patrol this community.

Here are some Spanish individuals that have called my house via cell phone on March 9, 2007 telling us he was looking for someone at our old address at 349 Seaman Street; (732) 754-7776 and here is another Spanish individual (732) 425-7373 that called on March 4, 2007 in the morning and in the evening. In the morning at around 9:16am. he called and spoke to my dad and asked if someone called from this number. My dad said no. Later he spoke to my mother at around 5:10pm and said "sorry I got the wrong number."

Your investigators may require surveillance of these individuals, since they are here 24 hours a day. There is a sense of urgency, because I believe they do not have good intentions. Here are some description of the cars that I have described along with this letter.

On the above date at approx. 0024 Hrs. the undersigned and Det. Levine had occasion to be in the area of Easton Ave. and Hall St. (Train Station). We were in this area looking for several suspects who we had received information on. The information that we had received was that several black males had went over to New York to bring back a quantity of drugs. One of the black males was wearing blue shorts and a black T-shirt. This black male was to get off at the train station down town and return to the 176 Memorial Homes with the drugs. As I observed the suspect walking down the steps of the train station I thought that he was the suspect that the informant had given me a description of. As the suspect got closer to me he turned away from me turning his face so that I could not see it. He was now walking with another black male whom I did not know by name but did see around town before. Both Dennis Obado and the other black male that was walking with him turned away
